

Why DO YOU BELIEVE? What are your reasons? We are in the middle of a series exploring what I think are some very good reasons to believe which fly in the face of what are normally taken to be arguments against the Christian faith. We've talked about the knowability of truth, the trustworthiness of the Scriptures, and the justice of our God (specifically as understood in light of the difficult doctrine of Hell). After taking a break this past Sunday to celebrate our men, we

will look in the next couple of weeks at the church's supposed dark past, and how we can respond to the problem of evil in the world in light of the good God we claim to serve. After one more break in a couple of weeks to celebrate our faithful women, we will land this whole series on what is perhaps the most important reason to believe we can offer: a relationship with Jesus. These final three parts of the series in particular will be great opportunities to invite friends, family, and neighbors who have struggled with the reasonableness of the faith to be presented with powerful reasons to believe.

Here's another question for you: **WHY ARE YOU A PART OF FIRST BAPTIST OAKBORO?** That may not be a more significant question than why you believe, but in terms of your involvement here, it's right up there. So again: Why are you a part of First Baptist Oakboro? What are your reasons? Is it simply because your family has always come here? Is it because you've been given a role to play? Is there even more than that?

In the earliest church, the identity of the believers was wrapped up in the identity of the church itself such that they didn't see much in the way of separation between the two. Too often today, believers construct their identities apart from the church. The church isn't someone they are, it's a place they go. I submit to you that this is not things as they should be.

While I do not think people need to necessarily spend more time at the church than they already do, when a church body is clear about its own God-given identity, the individual members can begin to see themselves through that lens. The identity of the church begins to inform their own identity such that instead of individuals who go to a church, they begin to see themselves as parts of a body. When this happens, the group begins to move together in pursuit of the kingdom of God in ways far more powerful than merely a group of individuals heading in somewhat the same direction can achieve. And when this happens, the church begins to grow in the ways God designed it to grow. This is the sweet spot.

Starting next month, we are going to have a conversation about who God made us to be and how we can become more fully that church. This will be an important first step in the direction of our sweet spot. You will not want to miss a single part of this conversation.






"To my church family, I want to thank everyone who have helped me during Mitchell's time in the hospital and other
