

There really wasn't a point to that beyond sharing a joke Josiah shared with me the other day to make you smile. Even if you've heard it before and are now rolling your eyes, it still might have elicited at least a chuckle. Sometimes it's easy to get stuck in a pattern in which we

forget to smile. We get so busy running around trying to keep all of our plates spinning in the air that we overlook the simple joys of life like a silly joke. The same thing can happen in the life of the church. We get so busy trying to serve the Lord that we forget about basking in the joy of the Lord.

This is all running through my mind because the next few weeks and months are going to feel busy. We have something different and special going on for each of the next five Sundays. 
Taking this path will not bring us joy. The service will become a chore. We will grow tired and weary. We may even quit and go home wondering why we signed up for this stress in the first place.

July 26: Back to School Pool Party


Now, here's why our student ministry will be kicking it into overdrive during June and July: (See List Above)
