

Carroll's (the guy who wrote Alice in Wonderland) poem, "The Walrus and the Carpenter," always ring in my mind in a season of change. The reason is that they were the words my 8th grade algebra teacher, Mr. Brock, always greeted us with in class on the day he gave us a new seating chart. I'm not sure why they have stuck with me for so long. I suspect the reason is that Mr. Brock was just that effective of a teacher. I still remember several other things that were integral parts of his class including even a little bit of math (ask me about "the Battle of Integer Hill" sometime).

Those words from Carroll, though, have probably stuck around the longest. As I write this, we are in a season of change at First Baptist Oakboro.

Some of it is just the changing of the seasons. In case you hadn't noticed, somebody clearly forgot to pay the AC bill outside which is usually a pretty good signal that we are in the thick of summer. Seasons change from one to the other and back again. That's normal. That kind of a chance is a good reminder that some things are still the way they have always been. The onset of summer has brought a brief pause to The Gathering Place. That's not necessarily a welcome change, but it is a healthy one. We all get a bit of time to rest and recreate, but all with an anticipatory eye toward its August return and a renewal of that cherished time of fellowship and discipleship in our regular rhythm.

Other changes are building, but still have not arrived in full. As we talked about a couple of weeks ago, we are moving smoothly and steadily forward with our plans to build a new space for worship that will be added on to our existing sanctuary building, a project that will include many renovations in the old part of the building. That will be a significant change to the look and feel of how we do things around here, and a welcome one at that. As we talked about, part of that project is being driven by convenience, but a larger part of it is being driven by the Gospel. Sharing the Gospel and making disciples intentionally in our

culture is made enormously more effective by not simply having enough space (which we do), but by having the right kind of space (which we need more of).

As we keep that latter fact firmly in mind, letting not just the truth, but the necessity of it drive us forward, we will indeed come to see this particular change have a profound impact on our efforts to proclaim the Gospel and make disciples in Oakboro and beyond. Go ahead and put it on your calendar to be here the whole month of October as we step forward together into embracing this change.

Still other changes are already upon us. Sunday will be Nate and Marisa's final Sunday worshiping with us as members of this community. We are launching them out in pursuit of God's call on their lives to pursue a path of church planting that will take them first to Fredericksburg, VA, and ultimately to New Orleans, LA. This will be a big change for them and for us. Yet as we can see in God's call on the church in Antioch to send out Paul and Barnabas to plant churches across Asia Minor in Acts 13, big changes can pave the way for great growth of the church both at home and abroad. We are excited for them and excited to hear the stories of how God continues using them to make disciples and grow His kingdom.

And yet, for all the things that are changing around here, some things are not. We are still a people with whom anyone can connect to grow in Christ and reach out for His kingdom. I don't know if you've been looking around the room on Sunday mornings lately, but more and more people are discovering that and taking the steps to explore what that could look like in their life with us. We are still committed to seeing the Gospel advanced in the Oakboro community and beyond. We are still going to keep pouring great time and energy and resources into proclaiming the Gospel into the hearts and minds of our young people. We are going to keep ministering to families of all shapes and sizes in order to equip them to take part in the passing of the faith to the next generation. We are still going to be the loving, welcoming, fellowship community you know and love. We are simply following God's lead in pursuing becoming the church He has called and created us to be in new and exciting ways that will lead to more kingdom growth.

With our feet planted firmly on the Gospel foundation that can sustain us, we will not stop surging forward in pursuit of Jesus together, celebrating where we have been while embracing where we are going, so that His kingdom grows all the more. I can't wait, and I hope you can't either. Good days are ahead of us.


