

Baptism is not the end of someone's journey of faith.

It sometimes gets treated like it. In nearly 16 years of ministry, I've seen parents bring their kids for baptism who may have made an honest profession of faith, but they may also be there because their parents want them to be baptized. Baptists have occasionally treated baptism—especially for kids—like a cultural rite of passage that is different from what traditions that practice

infant baptism or even adolescent confirmation with sprinkling only in how wet the subject is when it's all said and done.

Someone who gets baptized and then never grows in their faith lives in such a way as to suggest that the baptism may have been just a religious rite rather than an honest proclamation of saving faith by way of the symbol Jesus Himself commanded us to use for such a thing.

That latter pathway is the goal. It's also the beginning. It's the beginning of a journey after Jesus that will last for the rest of our lives and will take us—if we let Him—to places we cannot imagine sitting where we are right now. Maybe you've experienced that personally. You cannot imagine what your life might have looked like without Jesus. It hasn't always been easy. Sometimes it has been excruciatingly hard. But it wouldn't have been the same or nearly as good without Him.

If that has been your experience, you need to encourage that same faithfulness over time in the lives of those around you who are new to the journey. That's how disciples get made. And while baptism is a fundamental part of who we are as, you know, Baptists, making disciples is our real goal. That's the real job Jesus gave us to do. We are to make disciples who make disciples.

A couple of weeks ago, we celebrated together the beginning and the continuation of five journeys after Jesus. Just this past Sunday, we celebrated another journey's starting with a profession of faith. That means we'll fill up that tank again here soon. Keep watching for more and more of God's work in our midst. He's up to something.

In fact, I've been telling you that for months in this very space. God is up to something in our midst. His Spirit is moving. I've been telling you to watch for signs of Gospel fruit from His work coming to bear. Well...here you go. And there's more to come. When God's Spirit starts moving, it isn't often in fits and starts. It may start slowly, but once the growing season hits, the results are generally pretty spectacular.

So then, what can we do to keep this exciting momentum rolling forward?

The first thing is to pray. Constantly. Fervently. Prayer is the gas that fuels every true Gospel engine. It is the oil that keeps all the parts well-lubricated and operating properly. If you take the engine out of a plane soaring through the air, it may yet glide for a little while, but a crash is coming. Our commitment to prayer as a congregation is what will keep our Gospel engine humming along as it should.

The second thing is to keep welcoming—not merely greeting, but welcoming—the new people God keeps sending our way. Don't smother them. Welcome them. Invite them forward into the life of the church, especially The Gathering Place. When you arrive at The Gathering Place on Wednesday evenings, be on the lookout for people who are still on the periphery of the community and be intentional about sitting with them and engaging them in conversation. Don't ever let somebody new sit by themselves if you can help it.

Speaking of inviting, the third thing is to keep inviting people to church. The vast majority of people who are here, are here because they were invited. So, invite away. Some will politely refuse. Some will not so politely refuse. But some will accept, and come, and hear the Gospel, and have their lives transformed. Jesus said those seeds that land in good soil like that tend to bear a lot of fruit. It just takes one successful seed to generate an incredible yield, but you have to sow a lot of seeds to find that one. Sow liberally by inviting regularly.

One last thing is what we are all going to do together in the coming months. The more people we see connecting here—and especially the more young families—the more pressing our need for more space is becoming. Well, the design process for that space is moving along steadily. There are many minute details involved in the process, but they are all falling into place bit by bit. That's our builders' part of the process. Our part is going to be to pray and to give sacrificially. We can't do this, we can't grow God's kingdom as He is calling us, unless we all commit to be fully invested in the effort. When we do, the results will be pretty special.

Stay tuned and be prayerfully preparing for next month when we will be talking about all of this in a whole lot more detail and direction. Until then, let's keep on harvesting the Gospel fruit we see growing, and working the land to see even more.
