

When God shows up, everything changes.

Sometimes the change is immediately obvious.

When God showed up on Mount Carmel when Elijah was facing off in a spiritual throwdown with the 400 prophets of Baal (read about it in 1 Kings 18), there was no doubt about it. Fire shot down from the sky and incinerated the sacrifice that Elijah had prepared.

Everybody in the crowd watching the show dropped to their knees in worship of the God who was very obviously real and present.

When God showed up on the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2, no one could deny it. The wind of the Holy Spirit came rushing into the room, tongues of fire appeared over the heads of all the disciples, and they all started speaking in languages other than their native tongue. The scene was dramatic enough that people walking out on the street heard the commotion, stopped to ask about it, and Peter got to deliver the very first sermon in the history of the church.

Sometimes, though, when God shows up the impact isn't immediately obvious. God showed up in the story of Ruth which was taking place in the darkest hour of the story of Judges. Nobody knew about it until much, much later beyond those who experienced it the most personally.

The same thing goes with the story we looked at this past Sunday morning about the church in Acts 4. God showed up in response to the believers' prayer for Gospel boldness. When He did, "the place where they were assembled was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit..." But nobody outside of that room had any idea what had just been unleashed on the inside. The members of the early church didn't even know the full extent of what they had just encountered.

But one day they would. They all would. There wouldn't be any rational denying what God was doing. The church continued to grow and spread and here we are all still to this day.

Church, over the last month, we saw God show up. He showed up as we celebrated a new profession of faith. He showed up as we worshiped. He showed up as we unveiled our building plans. He showed up as we celebrated new baptisms. He showed up as we continued to see record-sized crowds at the Gathering Place including huge numbers of kids and youth who are hungry to experience genuine Christian community and

hear the Gospel. He showed up as we committed together to give—over a quarter of a million dollars so far!—to the work of expanding and renovating our old sanctuary building.

Now, from the outside looking in, not many people are going to have any idea what has been started. They don't know the Gospel impact that's coming in the days ahead of us. They don't know how God's Spirit is moving among His people in this church. But they will. Soon, they all will. They will all know the power of Christ through His faithful church. They will all know the love of Christ as we lavish it on the community around us and the world on outward from there. They will all know the joy of God's kingdom as we demonstrate it for them. They will all know the power of real Gospel community as they experience it through us.

To God be the glory, great things He has done!

Now, though, is not the time to sit back and passively wait to receive what God intends to give. Now is the time to exercise the patience of James, Jesus' brother. This is a patience one commentator once called a "militant patience." It is the patience of actively doing the work of the Lord in all the ways we can with all the people we can in all the places we can for as long as we can. It is the patience of honoring our commitments whatever shape or form they happen to take. It is the patience of actively making ready to be a part of God's work as He continues to unleash it in our midst.

When God shows up, everything changes. Changes are coming. May the first and best changes be in our hearts and minds as we are evermore committed to the advance of His kingdom together.


