

God's timing is an interesting thing. In many, if not most cases, we don't see or understand it until we can look back with the clarity of hindsight. Other times, things line up in such a way that you start to get the sense that God is up to something when you're still in the middle of a situation.

Track with me here for just a second. We are in the midst of a building process. Recent conversations with our design-build firm have put the potential start to actually moving dirt around in early-to mid-summer. The process of bringing this long-developing vision into reality is something God has been leading us faithfully forward in for a long time. He's not going to stop now. A big part of how He is going to do that is through our collective commitment to sacrificial generosity in the years ahead of us. He'll yet surprise us in other ways because that's the kind of thing He does, but our part with His power will be significant. The ownership that is going to give us of this bold step to advance God's kingdom in this community and beyond will be an important part of our energetic commitment to moving forward together.

The goal of this project, though, isn't just to build and renovate our facilities. It isn't even just to expand God's kingdom. It is to lead us forward as a church to know God more together. That knowledge will lead to greater trust on our part, which will lead to more radical acts of obedience and faithfulness, which will result in more disciples being made and sent near and far, which will be the thing that grows God's kingdom. Knowledge of God is the key.

This month (starting last Sunday), we are having a conversation on Sunday mornings about marriage. Yes, I know it's more than a little cliché to have a sermon series about marriage timed to end the Sunday after Valentine's Day, but that's the season we are in, so it seemed right to talk about it. As we talked about in the first part of this journey last week, if we are going to love our spouse properly, we have to love God first and most. Well, guess how you come to love God first and most in your life. You get to know Him better. To know God is to love Him because He is love. In the second part of the series coming this Sunday, as we talk about intimacy in marriage, one of the main points in the message will be that if we want to have greater intimacy in our relationships, we have to be better connected to God. That is, we have to know Him more and better.

Last week, I finally picked up my recently acquired copy of J.I. Packer's Christian classic, *Knowing God*. It may shock some of you that I'm just now reading that. Others are wondering who J.I. Packer is. Either way, the book is about what its title suggests. At the time I'm writing this, I started the actual reading yesterday, so I haven't gotten very far yet. Even so, the point has been profound.

Knowing God is the most important thing we can know. No other knowledge surpasses it. Knowing God is really the foundation for all true knowledge. We can know about a lot of things, but unless we know God, we don't actually know any of it like it can and should be known. This makes perfect sense too, since He is the one who created all of it. Mere knowledge about God won't do. Such incomplete knowledge doesn't benefit our lives in the way we need it to. It doesn't give us access to eternal life in Christ.

Well, if you're keeping score with me, that's three different ways the significance of our knowing God has been emphasized to me in just the last 24-hours at the time of my writing this on Friday afternoon. Do you think perhaps that He's trying to tell us something? If we are going to move forward together as a church, becoming all the time more fully the church our God has designed us to be for the season we are in, the engine that will properly drive us is our knowledge of God.

As a church we need to work together to increase our knowledge of God. This applies both personally in our own devotional times, but also corporately as we work together to help one another to know Him more. This happens formally in the context of things like Sunday school or Wednesday night Bible studies, but also more informally as older members of the congregation are intentional about doing life alongside younger members, letting them see firsthand the fruits of knowing God. If you are not fully connected to what is going on around here, if you are not fully committed to our journey of knowing God more and by that becoming more the church He designed us to be, allow me to invite you to fix that. Come and be a fully committed and invested part of our journey to know God more and to live in light of that knowledge in everything we do. God is moving in our midst. I can't wait to see and experience with you what He does next.

at the building entrances.





Dear Parents:

It's that time of the year again... CAMP! This year we will be returning to Caswell on June 16-20.

Overview

- The 2025 camp theme is REMAIN. Based on John 15:4-5, REMAIN encourages students to abide in Jesus so
 they would bear much fruit. This isn't a one-time occurrence, but characteristic of a life devoted to following
 Jesus every day. The challenge to remain is to be there and stay there.
- 2. We have limited spots for Caswell. Camp Caswell is always at capacity. If our students want to attend, a non-refundable \$50.00 deposit must be submitted prior to Feb. 15. We have spots for only 14 female students and 14 male students, and they are available on a first come first serve basis. Please make checks payable to First Baptist Oakboro and put "camp deposit" in the memo.
- 3. The full cost for camp is well over \$500.00 after all expenses are factored in; However, the church has set aside some designated monies for Camp this year, and we'll also be doing a few fundraising events for camp and mission projects. With that being said, the out-of-pocket cost for each student will be \$250 assuming successful fundraising efforts. Payment deadlines are as follows:

b.	1st installment	\$50.00	due prior to 3/15
c.	2 nd installment	\$50.00	due prior to 4/15
d.	3rd installment	\$50.00	due prior to 5/15
e.	4th installment	\$50.00	due prior to 6/15

- 4. The following are expectations from students/parents:
 - Students wanting to attend camp with us must attend either Sunday mornings or Wednesday evenings at FBO from February 15 – June 15.
 - Students must participate in <u>raffle ticket sales</u>, and one of the following: the <u>February 22 Valentines</u>
 Dinner from 4-8pm, or the <u>May 3 Hot Dog Supper and Bake Auction from 3-7pm</u>.
 - Attend the Mandatory Camp Informational Meeting on Wednesday, February 19, at 7:30 following the Wednesday evening activities.
 - i. Signing of camp-specific forms this will need to be done at this meeting
 - ii.Student conduct expectations agreement
 - iii. General itinerary
 - iv. Emergency contact information in case you need to get in touch
 - v. Medication and allergy protocol
